

SENATE FLOOR PROCEEDINGS

Sen. Kyl point of order that Section 1711 is legislation on an appropriations bill. The Chair ruled that the point of order was well taken and Section 1711 was struck from the bill.

Sen. Murray motion to proceed to the consideration of a number of amendments and modify them was objected to by Sen. Cochran.

Sen. DeMint point of order that Sec. 431 regarding tree assistance violates Rule XVI. The Chair put the question of germaneness regarding the text of Sec. 431 to the Senate. The Senate agreed that Sec. 431 is germane to the bill by a vote of 57-41. The point of order falls.

Sen. Alexander point of order that Sec 3001 constitutes legislation on an appropriations bill. The point of order was well taken and Sec. 3001 was struck from the bill.

H. R. 1591 (Emergency Supplemental Appropriations). The bill was read for a third time. The yeas and nays on final passage of the bill as amended were ordered. The bill was agreed to by a vote of 51-47.
