All post-cloture time will be considered expired, and the Senate will proceed to a roll call vote on the Cornyn amendment to modify the semiconductor incentives program of the Department of Commerce. (1858)
- Following the Cornyn (1858) vote, if a Budget Act point of order is raised, it is expected a motion to waive will be made, and the Senate will proceed to a roll call vote on the motion to waive.
